Sunday, May 4: Third Sunday of Easter

Scripture: Acts 9:1-6 (7-20), Psalm 30, Revelation 5:11-14, John 21:1-19

The first Sunday in May finds us moving through the fifty days of the Easter season and we hear two powerful stories of changes in those who find Christ. In the book of Acts, Saul, the great persecutor of the church, is blinded and meets Christ who calls him to a new mission. In the gospel of John, after the disciples go back to fishing, Jesus, unrecognized by the disciples, appears to the fisherman and directs them to a great catch. He then shares a meal of bread and fish with them on the beach and offers Peter a chance to recant his three pre-crucifixion denials. The psalm and passage from Revelation are both more positive and assure us of God's power. The psalm is a song of thanksgiving for recovery from grave illness which ends with the phrase, "You have turned my mourning into dancing, you have taken off my sackcloth and clothed me with joy." John's vision in the fifth chapter of the book of Revelation, which is also the inspiration for one of the more memorable choruses in Handel's Messiah, finds the angels and elders in heavenly throne singing, "Worthy is the Lamb," and "Blessing and honor and glory and might forever and ever."

Sunday, May 11: Fourth Sunday of Easter, Mother's Day

Scripture: Acts 9:36-43, Psalm 23, Revelation 7:9-17, John 10:22-30 In Revelation, the praise continues, as John, the writer of the book, has a vision of the heavenly throne where multitudes are praising God, singing, "Amen! Blessing and honor and glory and wisdom and thanksgiving and honor and power and might be to our God forever and ever! Amen!" In the book of Acts, hearing that Tabitha (Dorcas in Greek), a disciple of Christ, dies and Peter visits her, prays over her, and she then opens her eyes and becomes an inspiration for many throughout Joppa and for us too. The 23rd psalm begins with the familiar words, "The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not want." In the gospel of John, many Jews gathered around Jesus at the portico of Solomon asking him if he is the Messiah and Jesus responds, "You do not know me. My sheep hear my voice, and I know them, and they know me."

Sunday, May 18: Fifth Sunday of Easter

Scripture: Acts 11:1-18, Psalm 148, Revelation 21:1-6, John 13:31-35 Inclusive love is the theme for the scriptural lessons this Sunday. In John's gospel we hear Jesus giving us a new commandment, "... that you love one another. Just as I have loved, you also should love one another." In Acts, the mission to the Gentiles is better understood as Peter has a vision of clean and unclean food and hears further directions from the Holy Spirit. In the Psalm we are offered a song of praise for God's universal glory, while in Revelation the familiar words of the 21st chapter, where John sees a vision of a new heaven and a new earth, we read, "Death will be no more, mourning and crying and pain will be no more, and the first things have passed away."

Sunday, May 25: Sixth Sunday of Easter

Scripture: Acts 16:9-15, Psalm 67, Revelation 21:10 and 21:22-22:5, John 14:23-29

With Ascension Day following later in the week, on the sixth Sunday of Easter we learn of Paul, who, after being called by the Holy Spirit to Macedonia, meets and converts Lydia, the dealer of purple cloths. In the gospel lesson, with phrases like, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you," and "Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid," Jesus prepares his disciples for his death. He also promises them the presence of the Advocate, or Holy Spirit. Near the end of the book of Revelation and the Bible, we are given a vivid description of the New Jerusalem, the place where God and people live together. The psalm is a call for the nations to praise God.

Pastor's Message

This installment of my pastor's newsletter message is a big thank you note. As I sit at my desk on the Monday morning after our special Family Bible Worship service on Sunday, April 27, I am feeling exceptionally thankful.

I am thankful for the support of so many people on yesterday's special Sunday. I am thankful for Judith Robins of the "Daughter's of the American Revolution," for advertising their Family Bibe Genealogical Project and for joining us yesterday to share it with us. Judy was overwhelmed by our response. She told me it was the largest number of Bibles she has recorded at one event. She was a joy to work with and I am sure she felt welcomed by so many people in our congregation. For this I give thanks.

I am thankful for the families who brought their treasured Bibles to worship. It was so nice to see the Luthy and Reeder Family Bibles as well as the four very old Murphy family Bibles. Thank you to everyone who brought their Bibles and those who took the time to look at them and talk with these families. I also want to thank Keith Malkus for displaying the old German Bibles that are a part of our church history. He took the time, not only to get them out and put them on display, but to translate (with the help from the app on his phone) and help us understand the German title pages of these big old books. Thank you again, Keith and all of our families.

Thank you also goes out to Curtis, Tina, and our Choir for selecting and singing an anthem most appropriate for our special Sunday. Whenever possible, I try to create liturgies and select hymns which support the theme of the scriptures we use each week and this week it seemed like everything went together so well. Thanks again to our musicians!

Finally. on special occasions congregations may commission a hymn writer to create music or a hymn to be written to celebrate their event. We did just that Sunday. I am thankful, today, for the Council's approval to commission a hymn to be written by Carolyn Winfrey Gillette for our Family Bible Sunday. I am even more thankful that Ms. Winfrey Gillette was willing to share her exceptional hymn writing skills with us. She is a prolific hymn writer, and we have used her hymns frequently over the last ten years and I have heard many positive comments about her work from our members. Yesterday was no exception. The hymn, "Within Our Treasured Bible," was the perfect addition to our worship, and the lyrics she offered us fit in so well with the theme of our celebration. I cannot wait to complete the thank you note I will write to her. I also want to thank Terry Malkus for quickly framing the hymn and displaying the hymn in our church.

I am so very pleased with the Family Bible Sunday, and I hope everyone else shares my enthusiasm for Carolyn's work and for all that went into our special worship and celebration yesterday (Sunay, April 27). I look forward to other such special Sundays in the years ahead! I have included the text of the new hymn below.
